Reminders from the office:

We understand that unforeseen circumstances occur sometimes which causes tardiness. However, we ask that you please do your best to be on time to drop off and pick up your student(s). Class is disrupted and delayed when we have late arrivals in the morning and children tend to be upset or nervous when parents are late to pick up in the afternoon.

As a reminder;

Students who are late to school or are picked up late in the afternoon must be signed in/out by an adult in the office.

Outdoor Recess

We go outside for recess everyday unless it is raining or when the temperature is below 0 degrees(including windchill). Please make sure your child has a warm coat, hats, gloves, snow pants and snow boots which are all essential in keeping our student(s) warm while having fun outside.

Pre-Excused Absences (of 3 or more days) Extended absences can be costly in terms of work missed. It's usually assumed that work can easily be made up, but time spent on class activities such as discussions, experiments, and demonstrations can't be recaptured. Pursuant to the GBAPSD Board, a parent/guardian can excuse absences in writing before an absence occurs for not more than 10 days in a school year.

Please note:

If your student will be absent for an extended period of time that is not for a medical reason, the form below must be completed and returned to school for principal approval.




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From Curly Lambeau to the Patron Saint of Libraries:
